1. BRIEF HISTORY

Introduction

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women is a Catholic Minority Institution established and administrated by the Society of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann, Hyderabad, under the article 30(1) according to the Constitution of India. It is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) certificates and is affiliated to Osmania University. The College aims at preparing graduates to lead extraordinary lives in pursuit of truth and personal integrity. Students of all faiths are admitted without any discrimination of caste and creed. The College is committed to serve the poor, needy and socially backward. The College is provided with a hostel on the campus for outstation students.

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women had a humble beginning in 1993 with a small group of 90 students. Within a short span of time, it carved a niche as one of the best colleges in Osmania University for its academic standards. It is accredited by NAAC with grade 'A' in 2013 and Re-accredited with 'A+' grade in 2018. The Institution is conferred with Autonomous status by University Grants Commission on May 31, 2023. The serene campus is spread over 3 acres of land, with state of art laboratories, Snehitha Counselling Centre, Mass Communication studio, Language Lab, Psychology Lab, Spacious and well-ventilated ICT class rooms and staff rooms in two buildings. A large auditorium, audio-visual conference hall. modern room, gymnasium, playground and canteen are the additional facilities. The College is offering 21 graduate and 6 Post graduate programs. The College takes pride in possessing a team of 94 committed, dynamic, efficient and highly qualified teaching staff. The College imparts sound academic knowledge promoting the spiritual and social

values which help in the integrated growth of the students. The College promotes Universal brotherhood through prayer services, seminars and workshops. The secret of the success of the college is well-maintained discipline and high academic standard with research culture.

Our Management

The Congregation of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann (CSA) was founded in 1914 in Nalgonda District, Telangana by Rev.Fr. Silvio Pasquali PIME to spread the light of Christ through various charitable activities. 4.RULES & REGULATIONS

Every student of St. Pious X Degree & PG College is a unique gift of God, nurtured with love and wide opportunities for their total development. They are personally motivated at every level and guided to uphold the spirit of St. Pious X in their pursuit of acquiring knowledge. Truth, Purity of Life, Relationship and Interaction among the college community and outside the college are promoted by the Institution. Truth and Purity of life is the hallmark of St. Pious X College and is reflected in the character of the Piousians.

The students should behave politely and respectfully. They should abide by the rules and regulations stipulated by the college from time to time.

- ➤ The Working Schedule of the College is as follows:
 - The College functions from 9.10 am to 3.10 pm.
 - Prayer at 9:10am and a Lunch Break (12:50 pm -1:30 pm).
- Subject wise attendance is taken every period. The students are expected to have a minimum of 75% attendance in each subject and in general. Those with less than 75% attendance are not eligible to appear for end semester Examinations.
- > Students on leave should submit the leave letter to the class incharge lecturer duly signed by parent and principal.
- > Students should be regular, punctual to the classes, attend seminars and other academic activities.
- ➤ The students are expected to safeguard the property of the college.
- > It is the responsibility of the students to take care of their

- belongings. The college is not responsible for any loss of valuables like gold, mobile, money etc.
- ➤ The students are expected to carry their identity card all the time and they should be ready to produce it at any time when required by the college authorities.
- ➤ Any kind of demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the college or disrupts any activity in the college is forbidden.
- The student should make optimum use of the learning resources and other support services available in the institution.
- ➤ Permission for representing oneself in Extra-Curricular activities like sports, games, cultural festivals, NCC and NSS should be obtained in advance from Principal / Dean with a letter of request duly recommended by the staff member or the coordinator/the officer concerned.
- Students are expected to dress up in a simple and decent manner which confirms to the standards of modesty. Sleeveless, short tops, low waist jeans and tight garments are not allowed.
- Ragging is totally prohibited in the campus.

5. ADMINISTRATION AND FACULTY

The GB President appoints the Correspondent and the Principal of the College. 6. EXAMINATIONS AND EVALUATION

w.e.f. 2025-2026

For Undergraduates

Under Graduate Courses (CBCS) -CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

All Under Graduate courses would follow semester pattern with respect to Teaching and Evaluation. The Academic year is divided into Two Semesters. The first or Odd Semester is from July – December and the second or Even Semester is from December to May. The College has adopted the system of valuation based both on Continuous Internal Assessment (C.I.A.) and Semester-End Examination (S.E.E) Each Semester has Three Internal Examinations (C.I.A.) and one Semester End Examination (S.E.E) in the ratio of 50:50. Marks in each subject is a part of a reliable and sustainable evaluation process.

Graduation Day: Graduation Day, awarding Original degrees ceremony will be conducted in the College at the end of successful completion of the course for the students, who enroll themselves for the same through a notification with the approval of Parent University i.e., Osmania University by paying prescribed fee.

Rank: At the end of the course, a rank certificate can be issued, if needed, by the College for which the student must satisfy the following:

- 1. Student must complete the course within the duration of the course
- 2. A student is considered for the rank, if she completes the course without writing any arrear examinations.
- 3. Among all the graduated students, who tops the course with highest CGPA will be considered for awarding the rank.

Award of Grades, SGPA, CGPA:

- ➤ Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. In these Regulations one credit means one hour of teaching work or two hours of practical work per week.
- ➤ Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course (Paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a paper It is indicated by a Grade letter O, A, B, C, D, E and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade Letter.

- ➤ Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a paper.
- ➤ Credit Points refer to the product of No. of credits multiplied by the Grade Point for a given paper.
- ➤ Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) refers to the performance of the student in a given semester.
- ➤ SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the papers in a Semester.
- ➤ Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters (6 semesters).

9. LIBRARY FACILITIES

St Pious X Degree & PG College Library established in 1993 along with the inception of the college and serves its users from three locations (i.e., UG Library, PG Library & MBA Library). The library is located at the first floor and houses three spacious reading rooms, stack area, reference section and air conditioned eresource center.

The library services are fully computerized with Newgenlib Software with latest version Helium 3.3. The college library has also been subscribed to INFLIBNET- NLIST & DELNET databases for better research and academic pursuits.

11. STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

- Value Education: Educating the youth with human values is the core objective of the Institution. Value Education classes are held every Saturday. This helps them to maintain and care for human values, tradition and culture. Group discussions, Case studies, Values and Ethics and Personality Development programmes are taught and discussed during these classes.
- Counselling: The College has a close individual support from the faculty to identify the students' problems or difficulties and assist them in overcoming their emotional distress, personal problems concerning behavior or relationships through Snehitha Counselling Cell. Various orientation programmes are conducted by reputed psychologists to educate and clarify the doubts and enhance their psychological well-being. Faculty members act as mentors. In addition, the services of professional counselors are offered to the students at regular intervals on campus.
- **Mentoring system:** Every thirty students are allotted with a mentor. Student profile is maintained with necessary information. Each mentor meets the students periodically and extends academic as well as emotional guidance.
- Attendance: The students are expected to be regular to the college and put in not less than 75% attendance as per university rules. A student who fails to fulfill this criteria shall not be permitted to appear for University Examinations. Month wise attendance percentage will be displayed on the college

- notice board every month.
- A student absent to the college due to illness or any genuine reason, should submit the leave letter along with medical certificates to the Principal duly signed by the parent.
- Preparatory Bridge Courses: Preparatory Bridge Courses are conducted to bridge the gap in study skills of students from different backgrounds
 - Bridge course in English is conducted for vernacular students.
 - Special care is being extended to commerce students who come from Non-Commerce background. A short bridge course is offered to Non-Commerce students in Accounts and Basics of commerce
 - A 15 hrs. bridge course is offered in Chemistry to the students of B.Sc.
 - One week bridge course is offered for students with lack of computer knowledge to impart basic computer skills in them.
- Unit tests and Term examinations are conducted periodically to monitor students' academic performance and their Grades are sent to the parents through LMS. The Examination Committee plans for Internal Assessment Tests, Prefinal theory and practical examinations for all the students. Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation through assignments, projects, quiz, presentations, online test, JAM, open book models, book reviews, albums, Viva, Objective Type questions, Group discussion etc. keep the students always alert with their curriculum and regular to the classes.
- **Remedial program:** The remedial classes are given by the respective departments to the students who need more care and


