

1. BRIEF HISTORY

Introduction

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women is a Catholic Minority Institution established and administrated by the Society of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann, Hyderabad, under the article 30(1) according to the Constitution of India. It is recognized by UGC under 2(f) and 12(B) certificates and is affiliated to Osmania University. The College aims at preparing graduates to lead extraordinary lives in pursuit of truth and personal integrity. Students of all faiths are admitted without any discrimination of caste and creed. The College is committed to serve the poor, needy and socially backward. The College is provided with a hostel on the campus for outstation students.

St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women has a humble beginning in 1993 with a small group of 90 students. Within a short span of time, it has carved a niche as one of the best colleges in Osmania University for its academic standards. It is accredited by NAAC with grade 'A' in 2013 and Re-accredited with 'A+' grade in 2018. The serene campus is spread over 3 acres of land, with state of art of laboratories, Snehitha Counselling Centre, Mass Communication studio, Language Lab, Psychology Lab, Spacious and well-ventilated ICT class rooms and staff rooms in two buildings. A large auditorium, modern conference hall, audio-visual room, gymnasium, playground and canteen are the additional facilities. The College is offering 16 graduate and 6 Post graduate programs.

The College takes pride in possessing a team of committed, dynamic, efficient and highly qualified teaching staff.

The College imparts sound academic knowledge promoting the spiritual and social values which help in the integrated growth of the students. The College promotes universal brotherhood through prayer services, seminars and workshops. The secret of the success of the college is well-maintained discipline and high academic standard with research culture.

Our Management

The Congregation of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann (CSA) was founded in 1914 in Nalgonda District, Telangana by Rev.Fr. Silvio Pasquali PIME to spread the light of Christ through various charitable activities. The objectives of the Management are the culmination of the various qualities of its founder to eradicate poverty, social injustice, oppression and ignorance among rural masses, which is the very mission of Catechist Sisters of St. Ann. The Management has extended its services to 31 districts in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala in India, as well as in Italy and Tanzania.

3. RULES & REGULATIONS

Every student of St. Pious X Degree & PG College is a unique gift of God, nurtured with love and wide opportunities for their total development. They are personally motivated at every level and guided to uphold the spirit of St. Pious in their pursuit of acquiring knowledge. Truth, Purity of life, Relationship and Interaction among the college community and outside the college are promoted by the Institution. Truth and Purity of life is the hallmark of St. Pious College and is reflected in the character of the Piousians.

The students should behave politely and respectfully. They should abide by the rules and regulations stipulated by the college from time to time.

- The Working Schedule of the College is as follows: The College starts with a Prayer at 9:10 am and Lunch Break is 12:00 noon – 12:30 pm. The College functions from 9:10 am – 3:15 pm on week days and 9:10 am- 12:55 pm on Saturdays.
- Attendance is taken every period and also subject wise. The students are expected to have a minimum of 75% attendance in each subject and general attendance. Those with less than 75% attendance are not eligible to appear for University examinations.
- Attendance is taken by 9.30 am and absentee names are recorded. Parents are informed regularly about their ward's absence through SMS or App notification.

- Students on leave should submit the leave letter to the class in-charge lecturer duly signed by parent and Principal.
- Students should be regular, punctual to the classes, attend seminars and other academic activities.
- The students are expected to safeguard the property of the college.
- It is the responsibility of the students to take care of their belongings. The college is not responsible for any loss of valuables.
- The students are expected to carry their identity card all the time and they should be ready to produce it at any time when required by the college authorities.
- Any kind of demonstration that restricts the freedom of the members of the college or disrupts any activity in the college is forbidden.
- The Student should make optimum use of the learning resources and other support services available in the institution.
- Permission for representing oneself in Extra-Curricular activities like sports, games, cultural festivals, NCC and NSS should be obtained in advance from Principal / Vice-Principal with a letter of request duly recommended by the staff member or the officer concerned.
- Students are expected to dress up in a simple and decent manner which confirms to the standards of modesty. Sleeveless, short tops, low waist jeans and tight garments are not allowed.

- Ragging is totally prohibited in the campus.

- All types of Certificates will be issued on a two days notice.

4. ADMINISTRATION AND FACULTY

The St. Pious X Degree & PG College for Women is owned and managed by the Catechist Sisters of St. Ann (CSA). The Governing Body (GB) of the College is constituted by the CSA. The GB President appoints the Correspondent and the Principal of the College. The Correspondent and the Principal make the appointments of staff with approval from the Governing Body and the Affiliating University (i.e. Osmania University) representatives. The major financial and administrative policies of the College are formulated by the GB and executed by the Finance and Planning Committees through the Correspondent. The Correspondent shall be responsible for supervising the maintenance of the accounts and properties of the College in accordance with the rules stipulated by the University, Government and Management.

The general administration, academics, IQAC and stakeholders are vested in the Principal. She is assisted by the Campus coordinator in day-to-day administration of the college. In the absence of the Correspondent and the Principal, the Campus coordinator shall be in charge of the routine affairs of the College.

The Heads of the Departments will be responsible to the Principal for organization, co-ordination and smooth functioning of their departments. The various statutory and non-statutory committees will be responsible for conducting the curricular and co-curricular activities of the college effectively and implementing rules and regulations in co-ordination with the Student Council.

Class rooms in St. Pious X College are spacious accommodating a large number of students and are well ventilated. The classrooms are well equipped with ICT facilities such as LCD projectors, Smart boards and Internet.

English Language Lab

A synchronized language lab is established to improve the accent, intonation and expression of the students. It offers self-learning facilities wherein each student is provided with a computer, head phone and webcam in listening comprehension. Extensive practice in this lab boosts the confidence of the students and improves their language skills.

Commerce Lab

There is a full-fledged Commerce lab in the college. The main objective of this lab is to give practical orientation to the subjects of Commerce. All the important charts and documents are displayed. Practicals and viva-voce sessions are conducted regularly in the commerce lab.

Science Laboratories

The College emphasizes on Practical training of the students. Laboratories are the essential features of learning Science. All the science departments are well-equipped with latest and sophisticated instruments. These labs serve as potential centers for research and project works.

Mass Communication Studio

The Department of Mass Communication is well equipped with state of the art Production Studio, where the students are trained to create short documentaries and other production related activities. The sound proof studio is furnished with the latest technology of GREEN-MAT (Chroma) for remodeling backgrounds. The Mass Communication studio presents a complete professional setup for the students aspiring to join the field of Journalism and Media related profession.

Psychology Lab

Psychology lab is an important part of research and education at the department. Psychology equipment's consists of devices like a Tachistoscope, Esthesiometer, Self-Concept scale that are used based on self-efficacy theory and subjective task value and other tools such as Self Esteem, Moral Judgment, 16 PF, Culture Fair Test of Intelligence, K.I.E.I (Kundu), Aggression Questionnaire Well Being, Adjustment Inventory for learning activities.

Internet Enabled Computer Lab

St. Pious has a state-of-the art Hi-tech internet enabled computer lab, with an ideal student system ratio of 2:1 to sharpen technical skills and enable continuous support to students, helping them to familiarize with tech-savvy modern work places and thus preparing them for their careers.

Conference/Silver Jubilee Hall and Audio Visual Room

A spacious, aesthetically designed air conditioned conference hall and Silver Jubilee hall is a salient feature of the college. Various seminars, workshops, conferences and

meetings are held here. It is so well equipped that it becomes a mini theatre hall for film shows too. The smart board and LCD projector with a computer supports effective presentation by students, staff and guest speakers.

Auditorium

The college has a spacious Auditorium which can accommodate 600 students for academic and cultural programmes on various occasions. It also has an LCD projector with computer and sound system to aid audio-visual presentation.

Sports & Games

Sports is a vital activity required to enhance the overall growth of the students. The college witnessed a spectacular achievement in the field of sports. It is well equipped with sufficient indoor hall and outdoor facilities – Chess, Carrom, Basket Ball, Kho-Kho, Kabbadi, Volley Ball, Shuttle Badminton, Tenni-Koit, long jump, high jump, pit and Athletics.

Prayer Room

“Reverence to God is the beginning of knowledge”. The chapel of St. Pious is open for all, irrespective of religion and is a peaceful place where a person can be with herself and pray in tranquility.

Gymnasium

“A sound mind exists in a sound body”- A gym is provided for the students to keep their mind and body fit. It is a great help for physical exercise as well as to refresh the minds for teaching and learning .

Cafeteria

A hygienic and appetizing canteen caters to the students and staff with a healthy breakfast, lunch and refreshments.

Photocopy

Photocopying facility helps the students to get copies of reference from library, lecture synopsis, question papers and other necessary documents.

Residential Facilities – Hostel

“Home away from home” – a comfortable and homely hostel accommodates students from out stations within the state and other states of India. The hostelites lead a systematized life to help them to organize and fulfill their daily academic chores. Their needs are taken care of by the wardens-in-charge.

Security Facilities

As safety is the prime concern of the management, floor wise CCTV's are installed in the college campus and hostel block. 24 hours security is provided by the management by appointing security personnel to watch over the main gate.

In order to protect the campus from accidents fire extinguisher is placed on all floors. It is supervised and maintained by regular monitoring.

Reverse Osmosis-Purified Drinking Water

To provide safe and clean drinking water, a state-of-the-art mineral water plant has also been setup with constant supply of safe drinking water.

Wi-Fi

The college campus is upgraded to wireless with a local Wi-Fi hotspot of 60 Mbps bandwidth through the RELIANCE JIO. This provides a seamless connectivity across the entire campus to access information superhighway from anywhere in the campus through 22 Routers installed at various locations.

Public Address System

All the blocks in the campus are connected with intercom public addressing system with sufficient number of mikes which is used to communicate with all the class simultaneously.

Covid Guidelines

The college adheres to the covid guidelines specified by UGC. Staggered entry and exit of the students of different streams is maintained with 10 minutes gap

Entry without masks is strictly prohibited. A disinfection chamber is erected near the entrance for providing disinfection and ensure safety measures. Thermal checking and hand sanitizing are made mandatory. Signboards and banners are placed at the common points to remind the students of covid safety measures and precautions. Sanitizers are provided in every floor for the regular use by students.

7. LIBRARY FACILITIES

The library is the heart of the college. It supports intellectual growth and expands the horizons of learning. This academic hub is fully automated, stocked with a vast collection of latest books, periodicals, journals and CDs. This collection is expanded and updated every year. Students and faculty have access to a lending library, a reference library and e-library for a comprehensive approach to education. The library also offers photocopying and internet facilities. The library notice board gives attractive and informative displays on current topics. The 1st Sem students are acquainted with library information through an orientation programme.

Rules and Regulations for Library

1. Students shall observe silence in the reading halls and library premises.

4. Students shall not be allowed to sit in the library during the class hours.
5. Library books are to be used with care and returned on/ before the due date without damage.

6. A fine of Rs. 1/- is charged for each day, if a book is overdue for the first week and thereafter Rs.2/- for each day. If a book which is in demand is not returned on the due date a fine of Rs. 3/- will be charged per day.
7. Students will be checked before leaving the library.
8. Students must return all the books and cards and settle any outstanding dues at the end of the academic year to obtain the No Dues Certificate.
9. Cell Phones are not to be brought into the Library.
10. According to the management rules, Librarian reserves the right to suspend the membership of any member found misbehaving.

Such students are responsible for the safe custody of the books. In case of any damage or loss they should replace it with a new copy of the book or pay compensation as applicable. Sub-lending is not allowed and the books on loan must be returned at the end of each year, failing which books will not be lent in future.

8. CAMPUS SUPPORT ACTIVITIES

1) The Students' Council

The Students' Council members are elected at the beginning of every academic year by the class representatives. These members shoulder the responsibility of college activities—discipline, planning, management, welfare of the students and coordinate between the students and the staff. 3) Extension & Outreach Programmes

PEARL-(Pious Empowerment And Reach out Programme for Learning) “Service to man is service to GOD” is what PEARL, an Extension Service branch of the college believes in. The objectives of PEARL are to promote Education, Health Awareness, Women Empowerment and Community Service.

N.S.S – (National Service Scheme)

The two NSS units of St. Pious College provide a platform for community service and cater to those students who have inclination to developmental activities proving their motto “Not me but you”. NCC aims at development of leadership qualities, strong character, spirited service and creation of disciplined course that could be of use in national emergencies. They should put in minimum of 80 hours of work to be eligible for the award of certificate and pass C-Certificate examination.

Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR)

Share a Meal: The Institution has initiated an outreach program called 'Share a Meal' with an aim to fulfill the vision of the Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR) through its strategic goals and objectives. The program is directed towards supporting the well-being of the underprivileged students by providing meals once a month. To uphold the functioning of this program throughout the year, each department whole heartedly come forward to render services towards the achievement of this goal by taking support from the students and faculty of the department to provide a day's meal to the children in orphanage.

VOICE4Girls: VOICE4Girls is a social enterprise that works with adolescent girls in conducting activity-based camps in government and low-cost private schools where girls acquire critical knowledge, spoken English and life skills. The Institution encourages students to volunteer in activity based Camps by signing the internship with Voice4Girls that gives them an exposure and experience of the challenges faced by girls in rural India.

Our Support to Slum: As an Institutional Social Responsibility, St. Pious X Degree College for women has been supporting

Murukula Basti, a slum in Nacharam, Hyd. In this slum there are about 160 families and our institution will be working for its betterment. The various departments have taken up the responsibility of conducting necessary need based activities to the slum dwellers for their social upliftment.

Unnat Bharat Abhigyan:

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan is a flagship programme under ministry of human Resources Development (MHRD) Govt of India. The main objectives of this programme it encourages higher educational institutions (HEIS) of the country to adopt villages for their development. The college under “Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)” in the year 2019 was selected by Ministry of Human Resource Development to conduct various development activates under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Scheme.

4) Placement Cell

The Placement cell guides the students about their career, interacts with industrial representatives and organizes various seminars, conventions, educational programs. It offers training in communication skills, interview techniques, group discussions, debate, paper and oral presentations. The College is registered with **TASK** (Telangana Academy of Skill and Knowledge) which offers preplacement training for students and also conducts pooled campus placement drives.

The Cell arranges interviews for campus recruitment to the students in companies like TCS, Genpact, Dupont, IBM, UNISYS, Wipro, Amazon, Hinduja Global Solutions, Cognizant, ELICO, Synchrony finance, Sutherland Global

Services, ADP, GE-Capital, GVK Bio, Capital IQ, Tech Mahindra, KARVY etc. All final year students are advised to register for campus placement. Whenever campus placements are scheduled parents are expected to pick up the ward if it gets delayed. Students who are interested in attending off campus placements, are asked to inform the concerned placement officer prior and make necessary arrangements by themselves.

5) Pious Alumni Association

Every graduate and post graduate student of the college is encouraged to become members of Pious Alumni Association. It meets periodically and involves actively in the activities of the college. It aims at fostering fellowship between the college and alumnae.

6) Parent Teacher Association

Parents are welcomed to meet the in-charge faculty and the concerned subject teacher to discuss and review the progress of the students. The college arranges seminar for the parents and gives orientation to the parents on better parenting. Parents and teachers also exchange their views and ideas in shaping the future of their children. The Parent teacher Association meet will be conducted twice in a year.

7) Faith Formation (Campus Ministry)

All the Catholic students are given religion class one hour a week in which Bible study, quiz and prayer meetings are conducted. Such forms of prayer help the students to develop and strengthen Christian ideals and leadership.

All the Catholic students attend the retreat every year. This inspires the young minds with spiritual growth and values. It is compulsory for all Catholics to attend the annual retreat.

9) Cultural Activities

“RESONANCE” –Annual cultural events aims to tap the talents of the Piousians encouraging their creative skills and facilitates all-round development. Inter- collegiate and Intra Collegiate cultural competitions are held every year for a week to add more color and vigor to the lives of Piousians. “Resonance” offers a plethora of events boosting the confidence through competition and a sportive spirit.

10) The Pious Newsletter “FOCUS”

The newsletter “FOCUS” is released tri annually with updated news and views of campus. It focuses on academics, extracurricular programs, jubilations, outreach programmes, projects, publications, seminars, workshops, guest lectures, achievements, awards and sports with brief reports and photographs. On the whole it sums up the life and growth of the institution.

11) RADIO WAVE- You speak, we amplify...

As a part of Mass Communication club activity, Radio Wave is aired and broadcasted on issues like Human Values, National Festivals, Culture and Traditions. From jingle to jam the students do it all. The programs are designed and produced by the students in collaboration with various departments in campus that fundamentally renders the knowledge of production techniques, script writing and anchoring.

9. STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

- **Value Education:** Educating the youth with human values is the core objective of the institution. Value Education classes are held every Saturday. This helps them to maintain and care for human values, tradition and culture. Group discussions, Case studies, values and ethics and personality development programmes are taught and discussed during these classes.
- **Counselling:** The College has a close individual support from the faculty to identify the student's problems or difficulties and assist them in overcoming their emotional distress, personal problems concerning behavior or relationships through Snehitha Counselling Cell. Various orientation programmes are conducted by reputed psychologists to educate and clarify the doubts and enhance their psychological well-being. Faculty members act as mentors. In addition, the services of professional counselors are offered to the students at regular intervals on campus.
- **Mentoring system:** Every staff member is a mentor of her students. Student profile is maintained with necessary information. Each mentor meets the students periodically and extends academic as well as emotional guidance.
- **Attendance:** The students are expected to be regular to the college and put in not less than 75% attendance as per University rules. A student who fails to fulfill this criteria shall not be permitted to appear for University

Examinations. Month wise attendance percentage will be displayed on the college notice board every month.

- A student absent to the college due to illness or any genuine reason, should submit the leave letter along with medical certificates to the principal duly signed by the parent.
- **Preparatory Bridge Courses:** Preparatory Bridge Courses are conducted to bridge the gap in study skills of students from different backgrounds
- Bridge course in English is conducted for vernacular students.
- Special care is being extended to commerce students who come from Non-Commerce background. A short bridge course is offered to Non-Commerce students in Accounts and Basics of commerce
- A bridge course is offered to all the students of B.Sc.
- One week extra classes are conducted for students with lack of computer knowledge to impart basic computer skills in them.
- **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):** Osmania University has implemented CBCS pattern for its Under Graduate and Post Graduate programs from the academic year 2016-17. It is a semester based scheme in which every student has to get a minimum score (40%) to get promoted to the next semester. Evaluation pattern for each semester will

include 20 marks for Internals (2 Internal Assessments per course) and 80 marks for end semester exam.

- **Continuous Academic Assessment and Evaluation:** Unit tests and Term examinations are conducted periodically to monitor students' academic performance and their Grades are sent to the parents through progress reports. The Examination committee plans for Internal Assessment Tests, Prefinal theory and practical examinations for all the students. Continuous Comprehensive Evaluation through assignments, projects, quiz, presentations, online test, JAM , open book models, book reviews, albums, Viva, Objective Type questions, Group discussion etc. keep the students always alert with their curriculum and regular to the classes.
- **Remedial program:** The remedial classes are given by the respective departments to the students who need more care and attention to improve their academic performance. These classes are conducted after the college hours. The parents and guardians are also requested to take notice of such classes and monitor their wards periodically.
- **Supportive Classes:** Classes on computer applications are conducted for students coming from Non- Computer background, after college hours to strengthen their learning process.
- **Personality Development and Career Guidance:** St. Pious college aims at all-round development of the Piousians. Orientations, seminars and workshops are organized by

the various departments by inviting eminent guest speakers as resource persons. Such programmes build confidence, attitude and aptitude in the students to face challenges in Life.

- **Mock Viva and interviews:** Mock Viva is conducted by the concerned departments to inculcate an awareness and interest among the students to prepare and face real viva sessions effectively and face interviews successfully to excel in life.
- **Project Guidance:** To orient students towards research, project works are assigned to students which are to be carried out under the guidance of the faculty. The students are also encouraged to come up with innovative projects in various subjects through counseling given by the Departmental faculties. They are boosted with internship and provided an opportunity to sign up with reputed companies for quality project reports.
- **Orientation Programmes:** Personality development programmes are provided in goal- setting, etiquette and grooming, positive thinking, self-confidence, ice-breaking, case studies, aptitude tests, group discussions, oral and written, communication skills aiming at tracing the student's hidden talents and refine their individual skills and requirements.
- **Field Trips:** Industrial and field trips create awareness and provide an experiential learning and understanding of the practical aspects of the industry.

- **Guest Lectures/Extension lectures:** The Departments organizes subject lectures by inviting eminent scholars and experts from various Institutions and industries, corporate sector, segments of various departments of Universities and other reputed organizations.
- **Skill Enhancement:** Unemployability is today a greater issue than unemployment. Only 10% of fresh graduates are actually employable with their academic performance, which means that they need to be supplemented with various other skills. Hence, the college Management has decided to train the UG & PG students in collaboration with the reputed agencies through workshops and certificate courses.
- Students present subject related and general topics in their respective classrooms under the guidance of the faculty to develop their interpersonal communication skills and thus enhance their overall personality. In addition, the students also improve their presentation skills through projects, posters, and power-point and paper presentations.
- **Employability Skill Training:** Students are trained in interpersonal skills, the art of communication, building up a confident personality with positive attitude and effective communication.

Life Skills play a very significant role in the present scenario. Keeping this in view, Soft skill training is offered to the degree students which help them to communicate effectively, develop their personality and face interviews successfully.

❖ **LMS (Learning Management System):**

LMS also provides an open opportunity for the students to excel in the academic career. Learning management systems is designed to identify training and learning gaps, utilizing analytical data and reporting. LMS is focused on online learning delivery but also support a range of uses, acting as a platform for online content, attendance report, fee payment and notification to parents through SMS alert. In the higher education space, an LMS may offer classroom management for instructor-led training or a flipped classroom.

❖ **G-suite for Education:**

G Suite for Education is a suite of Google tools and web-based services such as Gmail, Calendar, Classroom, Google Meet, Contacts, Drive, Docs, Forms, Groups, Sheets, Sites, Slides, Talk/Hangouts, Vault, and Chrome Sync. that provides highly scalable environment for instant messaging and real time online collaboration.

It is used for Online classes, Assessment, Quizzing, Webinars, Faculty and student development programs and other real time collaboration. The College embraced this weaving technology to continue the Teaching and Learning process on the Online platform giving faculty the opportunity and sufficient training to integrate with G Suite for Education with a critical set of skills to conduct online classes seamlessly.
