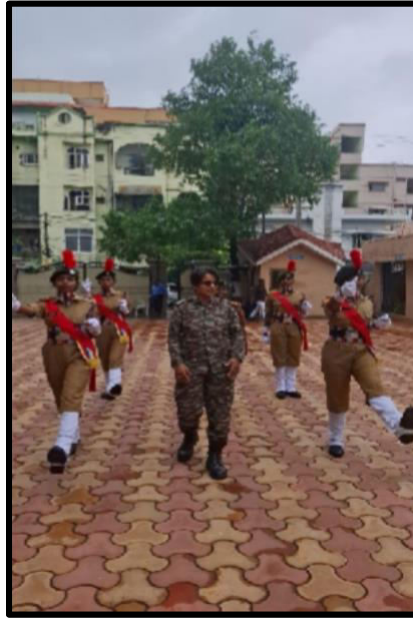
Activity – NCC Enrolment for the Training Year 2025

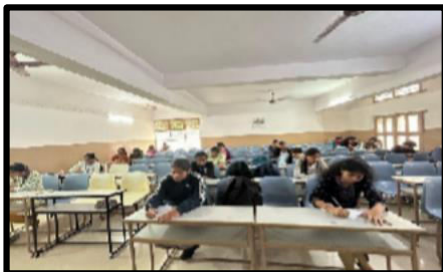

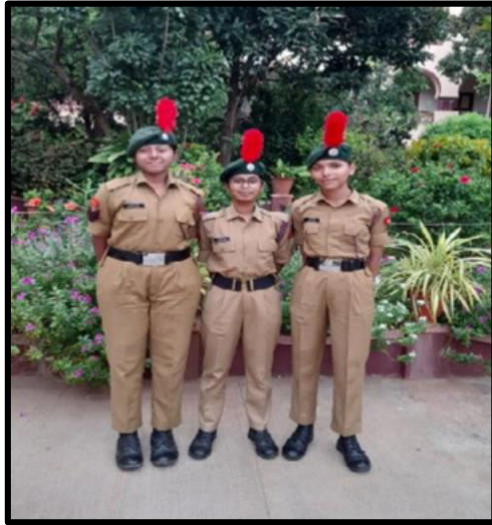
